UNCRC:

Rationale

Children should enjoy energetic activities both indoors and outdoors and the feeling of wellbeing that brings them. Outdoor play provides a multi-sensory environment which responds to individual learning interests. It compliments and enhances all aspects of children's development and learning through its physical, open-ended nature.

Consistency of Approach

We aim to create opportunities to explore environments by:

- Providing outdoor activities which focus on the changes of seasons
- Investigating and experimenting with a variety of natural resources
- Making discoveries using the senses
- Using language to describe, explain, predict, ask questions and develop ideas
- Developing an appreciation and a sense of wonder for natural beauty
- Developing sense of risk and responsibility to keep themselves and others safe
- Care for their immediate environment, local environment and the wider world
- Ensuring that at least 50% of the day can be spent outside
- Providing resources that allow children to self select
- Presenting resources in an attractive and stimulating ,manner
- Providing resources that cover all areas of the curriculum

- Model a positive attitude to the outdoors
- Ensuring the outdoor environment id safe and secure
- Raising parent awareness of the benefits of outdoor play
- Encouraging parents to engage with outdoor activities
