Glasgow Science Centre Visit

Last term, we were delighted to welcome the Glasgow Science Centre to our school. Pupils in P1-4 enjoyed an exciting show all about Oxygen, while P5-7 learned fascinating facts in a show on **Digestion**. After the shows, everyone had the chance to explore the **BodyVision** exhibits, where pupils discovered more about how the human body works. They examined x-ray scans, compared a healthy heart with a smoker's heart, tested their memory, learned about chromosomes, and much more! It was a fantastic, hands-on learning experience — and the children had great fun exploring and discovering!

This term, Read, Write, Count with the First Minister Bags and Bookbug Bags will be gifted to every Primary 1, 2 and 3 pupil. These bags, provided by the Scottish Book Trust through the Scottish Government's Read, Write, Count campaign, are packed with books and activities designed to inspire a lifelong love of reading, writing and counting. Each year, we use this special event to share fun and practical ways you can support your child's learning at home. This year, our focus will be on Listening and Talking.

School Improvement and Staff Development

Our Children, Their Nurturing Education

During our recent In-Service Days, staff took part in valuable professional learning focused on nurture and inclusive practice. We were delighted to welcome Paula Canon, our Educational Psychologist, and Christine Walker, our Nurture Teacher, who led sessions on the nurture principles and how these support the wellbeing and development of all learners. Staff also explored the CIRCLE framework, using it to reflect on and set up classroom environments that promote positive relationships, engagement, and inclusion for every child.

Last week, all staff took part in an after-school professional learning session focused on the principle that **all behaviour is communication**. During the session, staff explored ways to **recognise and support distressed or dysregulated behaviours**, helping us to better understand and respond to the needs of our pupils.

All of this work is also part of our journey towards achieving our **Silver Award for Nurture**.

Argyll and Bute's Counting On Framework

Teaching staff also took part in a workshop focused on **Argyll and Bute's Counting On framework**, which supports the teaching and learning of numeracy across the school. This session helped staff deepen their understanding of key numeracy concepts and explore effective strategies to support children's progress and confidence in mathematics.

ELCC Positive Statements Workshop

Our **ELCC team** recently took part in a **Positive Statements** workshop focusing on **child protection and safeguarding**. The session explored the importance of using **correct terminology for body parts** and promoting **consent at all ages** — for example, asking for permission before touching someone's face.

Staff also discussed ways to **challenge gender stereotypes** and encourage children to develop **respectful, inclusive attitudes** from an early age.

ELC Inspection

ELC were recently inspected by Care Inspectorate. We are delighted with the outcome and have plans to act on their recommendations to provide an even better service to our families. Well done ELC staff!

Update Nurture Space

During the Summer holidays, the Inclusion and Equalities Team and other authority representatives toured the school to look at potentials for our Nurture Space development. Mrs Smith is continuing discussions and planning around their recommendations. Additional information will be provided in due course.
